Dates: January 5–25

Foreword

Glory is not a moment we visit; it is a reality we are invited to live from.

Many believers are familiar with God's power but unfamiliar with His glory.

Power demonstrates ability; glory reveals nature. Power can touch circumstances; glory transforms people.

This devotional journey is not designed to excite you emotionally. It is designed to realign you spiritually.

Over these 21 days, your awareness will be sharpened, your inner life strengthened and your authority stabilized.

You are not entering these days to chase something distant; you are awakening to what has already been given.

Introduction

"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory." — 2 Corinthians 3:18

Glory is revealed before it is expressed. It is formed within before it governs without.

These 21 days are structured intentionally:

Days 1–7 awaken your awareness to glory.

Days 8–14 cultivate glory within through healing, renewal and rest.

Days 15–21 focus on glory expressed and established through authority, dominion, peace, order and thanksgiving.

Each day contains a Scripture reading, a devotional reflection and seven prayer points anchored in Scripture.

Weekends are included as personal devotion days, because glory is sustained privately, not only corporately. Do not rush; glory is not rushed.

Day 1 – Awakening to Glory

Scripture Reading:

“For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.”

Habakkuk 2:14

Devotional Thought:

Glory is not a distant concept; it is God revealing Himself. Every spiritual journey begins with awakening. You cannot walk in what you have not perceived. This first day is an invitation to open your heart and recognize that God’s glory is already present and accessible.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Spiritual awakening across STBC, sensitivity to God’s glory, removal of dullness.

Prayer Points:

1. Father, awaken my spirit to Your glory (Ephesians 1:18).
2. Remove spiritual dullness from my heart (Romans 13:11).
3. Let the knowledge of Your glory fill my life (Habakkuk 2:14).
4. Open my eyes to see beyond the natural (2 Kings 6:17).
5. Nurture hunger for Your presence within me (Psalm 42:1).
6. Let my life become a vessel of revelation (2 Corinthians 4:6).
7. I receive clarity and spiritual sensitivity today (Matthew 5:8).

Corporate Declarations:

- *Father, awaken our spirits to Your glory.*
 - *We reject spiritual blindness and dullness.*
 - *Let STBC be filled with the knowledge of Your glory.*
 - *Our eyes are open. Our hearts are receptive.*
 - *We are aligned with heaven’s reality*
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Day 2 – The Glory of His Presence

Scripture Reading:

“My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.” Exodus 33:14

Devotional Thought:

Glory is inseparable from God’s presence. Where His presence abides, rest replaces striving. Today, you are reminded that the presence of God is not something to chase; it is something to host.

Prayer Focus:

Hosting God’s presence in every STBC gathering, home, and leader.

Prayer Points:

1. Father, let Your presence rest upon me (Exodus 33:14).
2. I welcome Your abiding presence in my life (John 14:23).
3. Remove every distraction from intimacy (Psalm 27:4).
4. Teach me to dwell, not rush (Psalm 91:1).
5. Let rest replace anxiety in me (Hebrews 4:9).
6. I choose presence over performance (Luke 10:42).
7. I am aware of God with me today (Psalm 16:11).

Declarations:

- *Lord, let Your presence rest upon this church.*
 - *We choose presence over performance.*
 - *Striving is replaced with rest.*
 - *STBC carries Your abiding presence.*
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Day 3 – Glory That Transforms

Scripture Reading:

“But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.”

2 Corinthians 3:18

Devotional Thought:

Glory is transformative. When you behold Him, you are changed without force. Transformation is not self-improvement; it is exposure to God’s nature.

Prayer Focus:

Transformation of hearts, minds, and culture within the church.

Prayer Points:

1. Transform me by Your glory (2 Corinthians 3:18).
2. Remove old patterns that no longer align (Romans 12:2).
3. Let Christ be fully formed in me (Galatians 4:19).
4. I yield to divine change (Philippians 1:6).
5. Renew my mind through truth (Colossians 3:10).
6. Align my desires with heaven (Psalm 37:4).
7. I embrace spiritual growth today (Ephesians 4:23).

Declarations:

- *We are transformed by beholding Christ.*
 - *Old patterns fall away.*
 - *STBC reflects the image of Christ.*
 - *We move from glory to glory.*
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Day 4 – Glory That Dwells

Scripture Reading:

“And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:14

Devotional Thought:

God’s glory is not visiting; it dwells. Jesus revealed a glory that makes its home among people. Today, God desires not just moments but residence.

Prayer Focus:

God’s glory dwelling permanently in STBC, not visiting occasionally.

Prayer Points:

1. Let Your glory dwell in me (John 1:14).
2. Make my heart Your dwelling place (Ephesians 2:22).
3. Remove resistance to intimacy (James 4:8).
4. Teach me to abide continually (John 15:4).
5. I host Your presence daily (Psalm 84:1).
6. Let my life reflect Your nature (Colossians 1:27).
7. I am God’s dwelling place (1 Corinthians 3:16).

Declarations:

- *Lord, dwell among us permanently.*
 - *STBC is Your dwelling place.*
 - *We host Your presence daily.*
 - *Your glory rests here.*
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Day 5 – Glory and Sonship

Scripture Reading: “For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God.” Romans 8:19

Devotional Thought:

Glory reveals identity. Creation waits not for activity, but for sons who know who they are. You are not a servant striving for approval; you are a son carrying inheritance.

Prayer Focus:

Identity, maturity, and sonship revelation across the church.

Prayer Points:

1. I receive revelation of sonship (Romans 8:15).
2. Let identity replace insecurity (Galatians 4:7).
3. I walk boldly as a child of God (John 1:12).
4. Deliver me from orphan thinking (Psalm 68:5).
5. Let confidence rise within me (Hebrews 4:16).
6. I live from acceptance, not for it (Ephesians 1:6).
7. I manifest as a son of glory (Romans 8:19).

Declarations:

- *We walk as sons, not servants.*
 - *Orphan thinking is removed.*
 - *STBC manifests mature sons of God.*
 - *We carry Kingdom inheritance.*
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Day 6 – Glory and Obedience

Scripture Reading: *“He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him.” John 14:21*

Devotional Thought:

Obedience does not earn glory; it aligns you with it. Love expressed through obedience becomes a channel for deeper revelation.

Prayer Focus:

Alignment, obedience, and love-driven submission to God’s will.

Prayer Points:

1. Align my heart with Your will (John 14:21).
2. Teach me joyful obedience (Psalm 40:8).
3. Remove rebellion from my heart (1 Samuel 15:22).
4. Let love guide my actions (1 John 5:3).
5. Strengthen my obedience through grace (Titus 2:11–12).
6. Let revelation follow obedience (John 7:17).
7. I obey from love, not fear (Romans 8:1).

Declarations:

- *We obey from love, not fear.*
 - *Our obedience releases revelation.*
 - *STBC walks in divine alignment*
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Day 7 – Glory Rested (Weekend Personal Devotion Day)

Scripture Reading:

“And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done.” Genesis 2:2

Devotional Thought:

God rested in His glory. Rest is not inactivity; it is confidence in completion. Glory teaches us when to cease striving.

Prayer Focus:

Trust in God’s finished work and rest from anxiety-driven activity.

Prayer Points:

1. Teach me holy rest (Hebrews 4:10).
2. Remove anxiety-driven activity (Matthew 11:28).
3. Let trust replace toil (Psalm 127:2).
4. I rest in finished work (John 19:30).
5. My soul finds peace in You (Psalm 62:1).
6. I am secure in God’s care (Isaiah 26:3).
7. Rest strengthens my faith (Mark 6:31).

Declarations:

- *We rest in Christ’s finished work.*
 - *Anxiety has no place here.*
 - *Rest strengthens our faith.*
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Day 8 – Glory in the Word

Scripture Reading:

*“The entrance of Your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple.”
Psalm 119:130*

Devotional Thought:

Glory is sustained by the Word. Encounters fade when they are not anchored in truth. God’s Word does not merely inform; it illuminates. As you receive the Word, light floods your understanding and stabilizes your walk in glory.

Prayer Focus:

Revelation, truth, and scriptural foundation for STBC.

Prayer Points:

1. Let Your Word bring light to my life (Psalm 119:130).
2. Increase my appetite for truth (Jeremiah 15:16).
3. Align my thoughts with Scripture (Romans 12:2).
4. Let Your Word dwell richly in me (Colossians 3:16).
5. Break confusion through revelation (John 8:32).
6. Establish me through truth (Psalm 119:105).
7. I live by every word from God (Matthew 4:4).

Declarations:

- *God’s Word brings light to this house.*
 - *Confusion is broken by truth.*
 - *We are anchored in Scripture.*
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Day 9 – Glory and Faith

Scripture Reading: *“He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God.” Romans 4:20*

Devotional Thought:

Faith glorifies God. When you trust God beyond what you see, His glory is revealed through your confidence. Faith is not denial of facts; it is agreement with divine truth.

Prayer Focus:

Strengthened faith and confidence in God’s promises.

Prayer Points:

1. Strengthen my faith, Lord (Romans 4:20).
2. Remove doubt and fear from my heart (Mark 11:23).
3. Let faith rise above circumstances (2 Corinthians 5:7).
4. I choose trust over worry (Proverbs 3:5).
5. Anchor my hope in Your promises (Hebrews 11:1).
6. Let my faith glorify You (Hebrews 11:6).
7. I walk boldly in faith today (Habakkuk 2:4).

Declarations:

- *Our faith gives glory to God.*
 - *Doubt is silenced.*
 - *STBC walks by faith, not sight.*
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Day 10 – Glory in Prayer

Scripture Reading:

“Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know.” Jeremiah 33:3

Devotional Thought:

Prayer is communion, not persuasion. When you pray, you are not convincing God; you are aligning with His will. Glory flows through intimate conversation with Him.

Prayer Focus:

Prayer culture, intimacy, and spiritual alignment.

Prayer Points:

1. Draw me deeper into prayer (Jeremiah 33:3).
2. Let prayer become my delight (Psalm 27:8).
3. Remove distractions from my prayer life (Matthew 6:6).
4. Teach me to listen as I pray (John 10:27).
5. Release revelation through prayer (Ephesians 1:17).
6. Let prayer shape my desires (1 John 5:14).
7. I commune with God daily (Luke 18:1).

Declarations:

- *Prayer is our lifeline.*
 - *We hear God clearly.*
 - *STBC is a praying church.*
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Day 11 – Glory and Authority

Scripture Reading: *“Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you.” Luke 10:19*

Devotional Thought:

Glory produces authority. Authority is not volume or force; it is confidence rooted in identity. When you know who you are in Christ, you stand without intimidation.

Prayer Focus:

Kingdom authority, boldness, and dominion.

Prayer Points:

1. I receive authority in Christ (Luke 10:19).
2. Let fear lose its grip on me (2 Timothy 1:7).
3. Teach me to stand firm in authority (Ephesians 6:13).
4. I walk in boldness and clarity (Acts 4:29).
5. Align my authority with humility (James 4:6).
6. Let confidence replace insecurity (Hebrews 10:35).
7. I rule through Christ’s victory (Revelation 5:10).

Declarations:

- *We walk in Kingdom authority.*
 - *Fear has no grip on us.*
 - *STBC advances in dominion.*
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Day 12 – Glory in Weakness

Scripture Reading: *“And He said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.’” 2 Corinthians 12*

Devotional Thought:

God’s glory shines brightest in surrendered weakness. When strength ends, grace speaks. Weakness does not disqualify you; it invites divine power.

Prayer Focus:

Dependence on grace and strength in surrender.

Prayer Points:

1. Let Your grace be sufficient for me (2 Corinthians 12:9).
2. Teach me to depend on You fully (Psalm 73:26).
3. Remove pride from my heart (James 4:10).
4. Let strength rise from surrender (Isaiah 40:29).
5. Perfect Your power in me (2 Corinthians 12:9).
6. I trust You in my limitations (Philippians 4:13).
7. Your strength carries me forward (Psalm 18:32).

Declarations:

- *God’s grace sustains us.*
 - *His strength is perfected in us.*
 - *We rely fully on Christ.*
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Day 13 – Glory Revealed in Christ

Scripture Reading:

“And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one.” John 17:22

Prayer Focus:

Christ-centered identity and unity.

Devotional Thought:

Jesus is the full expression of God’s glory. What you see in Christ is what God intends for humanity. To behold Christ is to behold destiny.

Prayer Points:

1. Reveal Christ more clearly to me (John 17:22).
2. Let His life be formed in me (Galatians 2:20).
3. Remove distorted images of God (Hebrews 1:3).
4. I fix my eyes on Jesus (Hebrews 12:2).
5. Let Christ’s nature flow through me (Colossians 1:27).
6. I walk in His likeness (Romans 8:29).
7. Christ is glorified in me (Philippians 1:20).

Declarations:

- *Christ is glorified in STBC.*
 - *We walk in His likeness.*
 - *Unity flows from glory.*
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Day 14 – Glory and Dominion

Scripture Reading:

“Then the kingdom and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdoms under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people, the saints of the Most High.” Daniel 7:27

Devotional Thought:

Glory leads to dominion. Dominion is stewardship under God’s rule. You are called to govern from alignment, not ambition

Prayer Focus:

Kingdom stewardship, leadership, and influence.

Prayer Points:

1. Establish me in Kingdom dominion (Daniel 7:27).
2. Teach me to steward authority well (Genesis 1:28).
3. Let humility guard my leadership (Matthew 20:26).
4. I rule through righteousness (Romans 5:17).
5. Let wisdom guide my decisions (James 1:5).
6. Align my influence with heaven (Matthew 6:10).
7. I reign in life through Christ (Romans 5:17).

Declarations:

- *We reign in life through Christ.*
 - *Dominion is expressed through us.*
 - *STBC governs by righteousness.*
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Day 15 – Glory That Endures

Scripture Reading:

“The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever.” Isaiah 40:8

Devotional Thought:

God’s glory is not seasonal. What He establishes remains. Endurance is evidence of maturity in glory.

Prayer Focus:

Spiritual endurance, faithfulness, and stability in glory.

Prayer Points:

1. Establish me in enduring glory (Isaiah 40:8).
2. Strengthen me to remain faithful (Hebrews 10:23).
3. Let perseverance shape my walk (James 1:12).
4. Guard my heart against weariness (Galatians 6:9).
5. I remain rooted and grounded (Colossians 2:7).
6. Let stability define my life (Psalm 125:1).
7. I endure through grace (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Declarations:

- *We remain rooted and unshaken.*
 - *God’s work in us endures.*
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Day 16 – Glory That Governs

Scripture Reading:

“Of the increase of His government and peace there will be no end.” Isaiah 9:7

Devotional Thought:

Glory is governmental. God’s glory brings order, peace and justice. Where His rule is honored, confusion retreats.

Prayer Focus:

Divine order, peace, and Kingdom governance in this house

Prayer Points:

1. Let Your Kingdom govern my life (Isaiah 9:7).
2. Align my thoughts with Your rule (Romans 14:17).
3. Establish peace in my heart (Colossians 3:15).
4. Let righteousness guide me (Psalm 89:14).
5. Order my steps by Your Word (Psalm 37:23).
6. I submit to divine authority (James 4:7).
7. God’s Kingdom rules over me (Psalm 103:19).

Declarations:

- *God’s Kingdom governs this house.*
 - *Peace rules our hearts and decisions.*
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Day 17 – Glory in Trials

Scripture Reading:

“That the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ.” 1 Peter 1:7

Devotional Thought:

Trials refine glory. What is tested and remains becomes authentic. God uses pressure to reveal purity, not to destroy you.

Prayer Focus:

Refined faith and perseverance through challenges.

Prayer Points:

1. Strengthen me through trials (1 Peter 1:7).
2. Let faith be refined, not shaken (James 1:2–3).
3. I trust You in adversity (Psalm 66:10).
4. Let perseverance mature me (Romans 5:3–4).
5. Guard my heart from bitterness (Hebrews 12:15).
6. I overcome through endurance (Revelation 2:7).
7. Glory emerges from trials (2 Corinthians 4:17).

Declarations:

- *We overcome through faith.*
 - *Trials refine us, not break us*
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Day 18 – Glory and Gratitude

Scripture Reading:

Whoever offers praise glorifies Me; and to him who orders his conduct aright I will show the salvation of God.” Psalm 50:23

Devotional Thought:

Thanksgiving honors God. Gratitude keeps the heart soft and receptive. Glory flows where thanksgiving is cultivated.

Prayer Focus:

Thanksgiving, humility, praise and sustained joy.

Prayer Points:

1. Fill my heart with gratitude (Psalm 50:23).
2. Teach me to give thanks always (1 Thessalonians 5:18).
3. Remove entitlement from my heart (Luke 17:17–18).
4. Let praise rise continually (Hebrews 13:15).
5. Gratitude guards my peace (Philippians 4:6–7).
6. I acknowledge God’s goodness (Psalm 103:2).
7. Thanksgiving opens new doors (Colossians 3:17).

Declarations:

- *Gratitude fills this house.*
 - *Praise opens new doors*
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Day 19 – Glory That Remains

Scripture Reading:

You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain.”John 15:16

Devotional Thought:

Fruit that remains comes from abiding. Glory is preserved through consistency in relationship, not occasional encounters.

Prayer Focus:

Consistency, abiding, and lasting spiritual fruit.

Prayer Points:

1. Teach me to abide in You (John 15:4).
2. Let my life bear lasting fruit (John 15:16).
3. Remove distractions from devotion (Luke 10:41–42).
4. Strengthen my walk with You (Psalm 1:3).
5. Let faithfulness define me (Proverbs 28:20).
6. I remain connected to Christ (Colossians 2:6).
7. My fruit glorifies God (John 15:8).

Declarations:

- *Our fruit remains.*
 - *We abide in Christ continually.*
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Day 20 – Glory Completed

Scripture Reading:

Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ.”Philippians 1:6

Devotional Thought:

God completes what He begins. Glory is not partial. What God starts in you, He finishes with precision and purpose.

Prayer Focus:

Completion, assurance, and confidence in God’s faithfulness.

Prayer Points:

1. Complete Your work in me (Philippians 1:6).
2. Let confidence replace uncertainty (Hebrews 6:19).
3. Perfect what concerns me (Psalm 138:8).
4. I trust God’s timing (Ecclesiastes 3:11).
5. Let hope anchor my soul (Romans 15:13).
6. I am confident in God’s faithfulness (Lamentations 3:22–23).
7. My journey is secured in Christ (Colossians 2:10).

Declarations:

- *God completes what He starts.*
 - *Every work is perfected.*
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Day 21 – Glory Established

Scripture Reading:

“Then the kingdom and dominion... shall be given to the people, the saints of the Most High.” Daniel 7:27

Devotional Thought:

Glory is not fleeting; it is established. Dominion rests upon those who have been transformed, aligned and rooted. You stand now not as a seeker but as a steward of God’s glory.

Prayer Focus:

Established glory, Kingdom dominion, and spiritual authority.

Prayer Points:

1. Establish me in lasting glory (Daniel 7:27).
2. Let dominion be expressed through my life (Romans 5:17).
3. Seal every work You have done in me (Ephesians 1:13).
4. I stand unshaken and secure (Hebrews 12:28).
5. Let authority flow through humility (Matthew 5:5).
6. I govern from divine alignment (Psalm 110:2).
7. God’s glory is established in me forever (Isaiah 60:1).

Declarations:

- *Glory is established in STBC.*
 - *We walk in Kingdom dominion.*
 - *God’s rule is expressed through us.*
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Final Declaration

I have beheld His glory, I have been transformed by His glory and I now live from it.

What God revealed in these days, He has established permanently.

I walk in Kingdom dominion, clothed with authority, anchored in peace, and aligned with heaven.

I do not strive for glory; I steward it.

In 2026, I reign in life through Jesus Christ.

His Kingdom is expressed through me.

His glory rests upon me.

And His dominion advances through my life.
